I have endeavored to restrict errors and publish only authenticated and documented material, but realize that regardless of how careful one is, some will be overlooked. Therefore, should you discover anything which is not correct, I would appreciate very much being notified of it. The corrections will be made to the permanent files and to future editions of this work. I must ask, however, that you supply some sort of proof of any change (i.e. birth certificates, death documents, marriage licenses (all copies, of course....do not send original document.), etc.)

## NEW DATA

Much new data has already been received and filed and some corrections do already exist. I will be printing much of this information in upcoming editions of this newsletter....OR a separate addendum will be published. Regardless of the method, all data will be made available to all who want it.

Last Friday's "Dumfries & Galloway Standard (15-2-80) carried the information on the successful outcome of the McBray (or Makbray) saga so long under consideration by the Nithsdale District Council. William McDowell, Historian of Dumfries, in the 1st edition of his book (1867) listed the earliest known Provost of Dumfries

as Robert Makbrar or Mc Brair, 1469 ( 1453-4). This explains why the appropriate committee recommended "MAKBRAR". I do hope you feel the honour of your family name has now been vindicated.....

The following article appeared in the 30 Nov., 1979, edition of the "Dumfries and Galloway Standard" news:

**MACBRAIR STREET.....** Following on a letter from local historian James Urquhart the first known civic head of the royal burgh of Dumfries, Provost Makbrar, is to have a street named in his honour in the Lochvale housing area, if a recommendation by the general committee is accepted by Nithsdale District Council.

The Makbrars (more commonly known as Macbrairs) held the influential post of Provost of Dumfries for over a century in late medieval times. The family estates included Netherwood and Almagill (Dalton). The proposed street naming should please those descendants of the clan settled in America who have several times in recent years visited Dumfries in search of genealogical information.

The last in the line of Dumfries Provosts, the late Ernest Robertson, is remembered by Robertson Avenue in the Craigs Road area.

In February 1980 the renaming of the streets of Dumfries was finalized as witnessed by the next newsclipping which appeared in the "D & G Standard" on 15 Feb. 1980:

**OUR OLDEST PROVOST...** Dumfries oldest provost was Robert Makbrar (now-a-days spelt Mc Brair) who held that office more than 500 years ago, in 1469. Last month, following representations made by local historian, Mr. James Urquhart, Nithsdale District Council approved the naming of three thoroughfares in Lochvale after him. They will be Makbrar Road, Makbrar Place and Makbrar Court.....

Both Ethel and James t deserve the highest praise for their monumental and honourable task of calling for the proper recognition of our forefathers. Their efforts have been rewarded and all who possess the McBrayer/Brier name should feel proud of this distinction and recognition. Speaking on behalf of all the family everywhere.... Thanks for your interest, your love of the family honor and grand success. We all appreciate your labors.

### MCBRAYERS IN POLITICS

Thru the years many McBrayer have held elected and appointed offices from a local level to that of at least a state basis. In recent months additional members have 'run' for various posts; some were elected while others, unfortunately, were defeated in their bids for these offices.

Walter Terry McBrayer of Kentucky put forth a dramatic effort in the waning months of 1979 in his bid for the governorship of the state of Kentucky. He was, to the dismay of many, defeated in the primary election by now Gov. Brown. It is the hope of all that this temporary set-back will not deter Terry from future races, and, hopefully, future elected offices. Terry is an attorney at law in Kentucky (Lexington?), and is the son of Ernest Ward and Ethel Brown McBrayer. He is married to the former Ms. Mary Minton Ware, daughter of Mr. and Mrs James Culbertson Ware. We presently have no data on any children.

Another who suffered defeat was Odell Lavon McBrayer (8th gen, son of Odeil Luke and Ola Gregory McBrayer of Texas), who campaigned on the platform of reform for the seat of Gov. of Texas. Though this bid occurred some time back, we feel it only appropriate to include his endeavors with those of our more recent races. Odell is now campaigning for the office of Family Court Judge of Tarrant County (Dallas), Texas. (He is listed #315, p 173, Vol 1, of the new gen.)

Melvin McBrayer was more fortunate in his election, winning his battle for the seat of Mayor of Cannelton, Ind. An article which appeared in the Tell City, Ind., "News" on 7 Nov 1979, says of him, "Republican Melvin McBrayer scored an upset victory in Cannelton's mayoral contest..."

McBrayer, a political novice, repelled Democrat James Yaggi, a Cannelton Councilman, early in the voting reports. . . . " . Our congratulations to "His Honor, the Mayor". Melvin, 8th gen, is the son of Alton Lee McBrayer of the line of James (#2). We haven't received the data on him yet, but will pass it along as soon as we do.

**NEW DATA**

The following new information about ZACHARIAH PHILLIP MCBRAYER (file # 470, page 234) is submitted by Ethel Brier Koller. This data is in addition to that contained in the new book and can be saved or added. . . . .

Z.P. McBrayer was a banker in Anderson County, Kentucky. His father and mother were brought, at an early age, from Virginia to Harrod's Station, being among the first settlers of the State. His grandmother and grandfather are believed to be the first white people who died of natural causes in Ky. He received a good education, which he finished at Bacon College, Harrodsburg. At the age of 20 he went to California and there engaged in mining, trading, and politics; was Sheriff and Circuit Clerk for Yolo County, Calif., for 2 or 3 years' made some trading trips to South America, the Sandwich islands, and Salt Lake, leading an exceedingly active and successful life for 6 years. In 1856, he returned to Harrodsburg, and engaged in merchantile pursuits. In 1870, in connection with Messrs. Trapnell and Davis, he established the banking-house of which he is now a leading member (quote from reference material written during his life-time), having bought out the Commercial Bank of Harrodsburg, in which he was president. He has been Chairman of the Board of Town Trustees for a number of years; Sec. and Treasurer of the Board of Internal Improvements for Mercer Co.; originated and now president of the South-Western R.R., Democrat. Administrator, and guardian and trustee for a number of estates in his neighborhood. He was a Deacon in the Presbyterian Church. He was married in 1861 to Delia Haskins, a graduate of Tevis School at Shelbyville. Five living children; Maude, Sanford, Marie, Bessie, Musa.

"Virginia Genealogies-Hayden FY. 8162a P. 700, The old family bible of Dr Michael

Wallace, printed in Scotland in 1683, and containing the names, dates of birth, etc., of himself and children, is in the hands of his descendants, Judge W.H. (Wm. Harrison) McBrayer, Lawrenceburg, Ky. (This bible is most likely still in the hands of the descendants. If anyone knows the whereabouts of it, I would appreciate knowing. Possibly copies of some of the pages might be made.)

## HOW TO READ THE NEW GENEALOGY

There was one thing I forgot to mention or to include in the just finished book— the system that was used and the sequence in which the male generations were listed. The basic system is of an alpha-numeric pattern.

The number which precedes each individual sketch is the file number under which that information is filed in my records. Such as: (141) would refer to the folder on Henry Freeland McB. These file numbers are assigned in alphabetical order according to the FIRST name of the individual, with only the numbers "1", "2", & "3", being out of sequence as these numbers were assigned to the original three brothers, our immigrating ancestors, James, William, and David.

Immediately following the name of the individual is his generation—from his particular line. Example: (141) Henry Freeland McBayer, 5th gen. Following this is the ascending order of his ancestry. . . . (James—193, etc.). The number immediately following 'James' is his personal file number and if you desire data on this individual, you have only to look for this number in the sequential listing, in this case located on page 125.

Within the listings for the children of a particular family, you will find only the son's name shown followed by a file number if such a file exists for that son. If the son's listing contains data such as birth date, death date, etc., and no file number follows, it indicates no additional data on him is known. The daughters listing will contain their birth, marriage, and death dates, and to whom they married. (Additional data and lineage on the female generations will be contained in the next volume.)

I devised this system in hopes it would facilitate an easier method for you to trace your individual lines. . . . and to trace others, both in an ascending and descending order. If there are any questions, do not hesitate to ask.

And, please, bring to my attention immediately any corrections that need to be made. I hope to keep these records as complete and as accurate as possible, so your help is needed.
